 President McKenna called the meeting to order at 1:05pm; Commissioner Bergren led the pledge of allegiance

Tri-Commission Updates

- Chelan County Commission
 - Strategic Planning
 - Partnering with Heartwood Biomass and others to potentially locate a campus here
 - Purchased 3 acres in Olds Station for a satellite campus to include motor pool, coroner's office, and emergency management
 - Project Updates
 - Recent awards for Cascade Natural Infrastructure Fund

- Purchasing 12 acres for the Center for Drug and Alcohol Treatment; getting ready to bid
- Purchasing 3 parcels for Malaga Park
- Upgrade to Veteran's Services building
- Forestry resilience bond in Lake Wenatchee
- Icicle pumped irrigation project
- PUD / County franchise agreement PUD is working with County staff on issues
- Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority
 - Trades district near the airport; 12 buildings to be incubators for businesses; anticipated completion summer 2025 with an additional \$4M in federal dollars for phase 2
 - Pangborn Airport
 - Army National Guard has moved to Pangborn creating about 20 new jobs
 - 100 reservists train there one weekend per month
 - General Aviation building replacement
 - Fall 2025 project to repave runway; airport will be shut down for approximately 30 days
 - Thanks to Steve Wilkinson at the Chamber for leading a commercial air service working group
 - Malaga
 - PUD building the substation for Microsoft's facilities; buildings break ground soon
 - Water infrastructure improvements; phase 1 completed and previewed phase 2
 - Water infrastructure is built to benefit the community of Malaga
 - Cooling water system
 - Discussed traffic study and future plans
 - o Lineage Property redevelopment; looking for a grant to do some design work
 - Leading the Regional Sports Complex study
 - Once report is finalized, if elected officials agree, will go to a public vote for tax funding
 - Tax Increment Financing (TIF)
 - First project in Douglas County
 - Forming a district for property around Pangborn that doesn't have utilities will create a TIF to invest in infrastructure for next wave of growth
 - Strategic Plan due to be completed by the end of the year
- Chelan County PUD
 - Strategic Visioning Imagine 2075
 - Working on a 50-year vision; reviewed process
 - Customer-owner survey will launch next week
 - Expect to finalize plan near the end of the year, then work on shorter-term plans
 - o Rate Proposal
 - Proposed 2-year extension of 5-year rate plan with increases of 4% for water, 4% for wastewater and 3% for electric
 - Allows time to finalize visioning plan
 - Consider adding information to customer bills to show how much rates are offset by power sales
 - Large Load Framework
 - Guiding principles established by the Commission
 - Options for how large loads may be served
 - Reviewed public comments received to date and themes
 - Alternative generation resources we're looking at that in our 50-year vision
 - Educating ourselves on new technologies; held Clean Energy Expo in December
 - Fire Safety Outage Management was not put into effect during recent fires

 - Cascade Infrastructure grant pump station opens the door for affordable housing and economic development east of Chelan
 - o Tourism
 - Reviewing tourism code; want to give farmers the option to operate farmland
 - Have finished 2025 strategic funding roadmap for east Chelan reservoir, trail, facilities audit and analysis,
 Chelan gorge four-plex youth fields, and downtown revitalization
 - o Transportation benefit district on the November ballot
 - Transportation survey for community prioritization
 - Recycling center and glass crusher were destroyed by fire; working to bring that service back
 - o Colville Confederated Tribe members visited Chelan to learn more about upcoming projects
 - o Stayman Flats fire thanks to all who helped put that out
 - o Chelan airport water line is in design phase
- Jim Fletcher, Cashmere
 - o County fair is next weekend
 - Yonder cider grand opening on Saturday
 - Starting to rework comprehensive plans for the state
- Mike Poirier, Wenatchee
 - o Reviewing homeless plan at this week's City Council meeting; hiring a homeless response coordinator
 - o Looking for partners to help educate people around the 4th of July firework enforcement
 - o 3 of 8 directors have been replaced due to retirements
 - o Continue to work with legislators on Confluence Parkway; split into four phases
 - o Sales tax is down; 2025 budget will be status quo
 - o \$17M Convention Center project is a quarter of the way done
