#### **Business Line Financial Metrics and Rate Planning**

- Dave Nelson, Manager Strategic Financial Planning, provided information on business line financial policy metrics and rate planning for consideration
- Provided background information on business line financial policies, an extended view of business line financial metrics, and options for moving forward for 2025 and beyond
- Recommended continuing rate increases to keep pace with inflation at a minimum
  - One-to-five-year extension of the 2024 increases: 4% water, 4% wastewater, 3% fiber, and 3% electric
  - Commissioners support staff recommendation of extending the current rate plan for 2-3 years
- Discussed strategic planning considerations and next steps
