

Wenatchee Operations

- ALNW completes over 4100 flights annually
- The Wenatchee base completed 362 flights in FY24 across Washington
- The flight team that is based here is equipped to handle all Adult and Pediatric patients. Including cardiac assist devices and ECMO transports
- Each flight nurse completes over 100 hours of continuing education with clinical simulation


